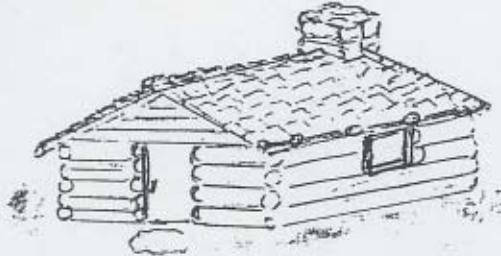


# Three Mile School

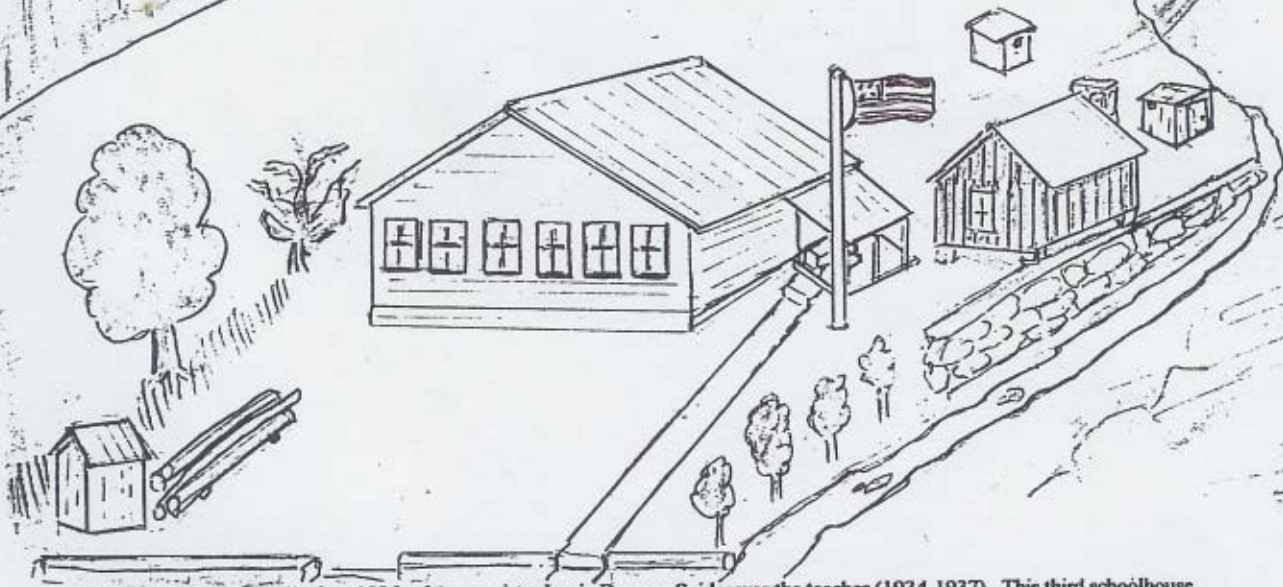
Located along Three Mile Run near Freed, Calhoun County, West Virginia



The first school was built circa 1855 and made of logs. It was on the farm of the founder and first teacher Joab Wolverton.



The second school was built circa 1890, and sat beside the roadway that ran up Three Mile Run. Early photos did not have a porch, but later school pictures did.



The third school was built circa 1936, when my sister Louie Dawson Snider was the teacher (1934-1937). This third schoolhouse was the one I attended. The cabin had been built about a year before I started to school. This school was sold at auction by the Calhoun County Board of Education in the late summer of 1957. Tony Elliott was the high bidder, and dismantled the building soon after the sale. The lumber was hauled to the lot adjoining the Strait Creek Baptist Church in Hartley where Robert Elliott intended to build himself a home. The house was never built and the lumber disappeared, one board at a time.

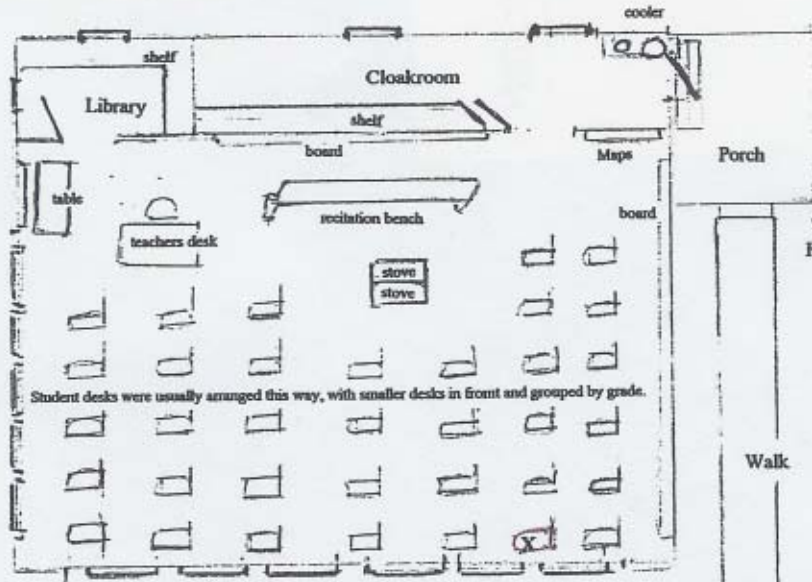
